**Summer Internship Available [#1]
Graduate Student in Environmental History to Assist with Mobile App
Development**

Location: Seattle, Washington USA

Dates: June – August 2016

Description: The American Society for Environmental History (www.aseh.net), has partnered with Three21 Innovations, a new company that specializes in mobile application development for humanities content. The company's mission is to employ digital media to connect a wide variety of users with communities and organizations, focusing on historical topics. Information on Three21 can be viewed at:

This project involves research on historical buildings and sites in the Seattle area for expansion of mobile apps now under development. A primary objective will be to add environmental content to these apps. The intern would be expected to research, write a 200-300 word narrative, and acquire 2-3 contemporary and historic photos for 50 sites. Each site will be prepared using the Content Creation Guide developed by Three21. Sites will be selected by the intern in consultation with Three21 and the ASEH executive director.

This company created a walking tour app for ASEH's Seattle conference, which can be viewed at <http://nextexithistory.com/> and by downloading the Next Exit History App from iTunes or Google Play. Look for the backpack titled ASEH Seattle. A backpack of Next Exit History sites for ASEH's San Francisco conference (2014) can be viewed in the same location.

Three21 in Seattle will oversee the project and supervise the intern's work, with the assistance of ASEH's executive director, who has experience researching local environmental records associated with historical buildings and sites (up to 40). This project includes the following advantages:

- It will introduce intern to the operations of a (new and growing) company.
- The intern will work collaboratively with professionals outside the university.
- The intern will learn about environmental records pertaining to the history of specific local sites.
- The intern will gain experience combining historical research and digital technologies.
- The intern will learn how environmental history can inform public outreach projects.

Requirements: The intern must be a current student enrolled in a related accredited graduate degree program in the Seattle/Tacoma area. The following tasks are required:

- Meet with Three21 and ASEH at outset of project to introduce Three21 and outline research plan
- Consult with regional repositories for location of records
- Once research plan is approved by THREE21 and ASEH, conduct research, keeping logs
- Prepare narrative text, historic and contemporary photos and references for 50 environmental sites in the Seattle area
- Deliver to THREE21 – including verbal presentation
- Write brief article for ASEH's newsletter on experience

Remuneration: This 4 to 8-week internship offers a stipend of \$3,000. Minor expenses, including copy costs and photograph costs, will be reimbursed. Lodging or living expenses not included.

The schedule is flexible; the intern could work part-time over the summer or full-time for approximately one month during the summer. Generally the intern is expected to begin by mid-June and to complete the project by mid-August, if not before.
